The Alzheimer's Association cordially invites you and your colleagues, professionals who works with people who have Alzheimer's' and related dementias, to participate in the Alzheimer's Association Massachusetts and New Hampshire Chapter's National Alzheimer's Project public input session on August 16<sup>th</sup> at the Newton, MA Public Library beginning at 6:00 p.m. The input session is an opportunity for you to let the federal government know about what should be included in a successful National Alzheimer's Plan.

As you may know, the National Alzheimer's Project Act received strong, bipartisan support in 111th Congress and was passed unanimously by both the U.S. House and Senate and signed into law by the President in January 2011. The National Alzheimer's Project requires creation of a national strategic plan to address the rapidly escalating Alzheimer's disease crisis, which will be annually reported to Congress.

The public input session is a unique event where you will be able to participate in informing the Executive Office of Health and Human Services in Washington D.C., including those living with Alzheimer's, their caregivers, representatives from the state and local government, and the research, health and long-term care communities about what must be addressed in the National Alzheimer's Plan.
